Pravin Dahal If it is technically possible, Windows EULA does not allow it:

Quoted from MS XP Pro EULA:
"You may install, use, access, display and run one copy of the Product on a single computer, such as a workstation, terminal or other device ("Workstation Computer"). The Product may not be used by more than two (2) processors at any one time on any single Workstation Computer."

Quoted from Section 2 (a) of MS Win 7 Pro EULA:
"One Copy per Computer. You may install one copy of the software on one computer. That computer is the "licensed computer.""

So, you should look at some other OS if you want a portable OS installation. :)

Although a little out of context here, another developer, who was also an MVP, was legally threatened just because he developed an extension to MS Visual Studio Express which provided a feature that was only available in the Pro/Enterprise edition.

Trying to do things that are forbidden or not mentioned in EULA is plain dangerous, legally. So, I think you should not even try it. You should be wary about these things bro. Use Linux, at least for these things, because if you use Linux no one is going to sue you for experimenting a little... :)
